BEFORE ME, the undersigned authority, on this day personally appeared the undersigned Affiant who, after being duly sworn by me, on oath, stated:

My name is Tracy Dotson, and I am a Peace Officer of the County of Dallas, Texas.

I have good reason to believe and do believe that on or about the 10th day of April 2017, one Miguel Hernandez who did then and there in the County of Dallas, Texas commit the offense of Illegal Voting, §64.012 Texas Elections Code, a Felony 3rd Degree.

My belief is based upon the following facts and information:

In March 2017, the District Attorney's Office initiated an investigation into allegations that Applications for Mail-In Ballots were being fraudulently submitted by a person named Jose Rodriguez. Attempts to contact Mr. Rodriguez at the address he listed on the Applications revealed he did not live at the stated address. Further investigative efforts led to the conclusion that this was, in all likelihood, a fictitious name.

An application to sequester suspicious ballots (and their attenuate paperwork) was granted by the presiding Judge of the 193rd Judicial District Court. As part of the criminal investigation, the ballots (and their attenuate paperwork) were examined, and it was determined that certain voters were "assisted" in filling out their mail-in ballots before they were returned to the Dallas County Elections Department by "Jose Rodriguez."

On May 31, 2017, one of these voters was contacted and the circumstances surrounding the investigation were discussed. One of the individuals in the household indicated she placed a blank ballot in the white envelope, placed it inside what is referred to as the "carrier envelope," and gave it to a person who, ostensibly, was going to mail it back to the Dallas County Elections Department. The voter did not sign the back of the "carrier envelope."

During the discussion, the ballot and the "carrier envelope" were shown to this individual. She indicated she identified herself on the back of the "carrier envelope" before giving it back to the person that collected it. Neither the signature of the voter or the line indicating assistance was needed was completed at the time she handed over the "carrier envelope." However, when the "carrier envelope" was returned to the Dallas County Elections Department, the ballot had been filled out, and both the "voter's signature line" and the "assisted by" line had been signed.

A photo lineup was shown to this person, and she identified "Miguel Hernandez" as the person to whom she gave the blank ballot and unsigned "carrier envelope." Therefore, by filling out the ballot, and by forging the voter's signature on the "carrier envelope," Miguel Hernandez did commit the offense of Illegal Voting pursuant to Tex. Elec. Code §64.012.

Wherefore, Affiant requests that an arrest warrant or capias be issued for the above-accused individual(s) in accordance with the law.
