


2018 General Election Early Voting Analysis October 30, 2018

The following information is based on data collected from the top 15 largest counties in the state only. It does not include data from all counties, but the information provides a snapshot of a large portion of the state's early voters. In 2014, these 15 counties accounted for 63.9% of all votes cast in the U.S. Senate race; 76.6% of all votes cast for David Alameel; and 56.6% of all votes cast for John Cornyn.

Early Voters – By Previous Election History



Are Republicans Showing Up to Vote?



The following is a breakdown of voters with previous Democratic Primary election history and whether they have voted early or not. For example, of the voters who have voted in all four of the previous four Democratic Primaries (2012 – 2018) in the largest counties, 73.4% have voted early.


Turnout by Previous Primary Voting Strength (Select counties only)

(In 2014, 51.8% of early voters were women, 44.1% were men, and


4.1% had no gender listed.)

By Hispanic Surname


Hispanic Surname: 19.1%
